Two sure signs you're getting old: You require math to verify your own age; and, you can't seem to do anything without evoking a sense of nostalgia.

As I'm typing, I'm testing my theory. The first precept holds. How old am I? My initial instinct – 54. Checking the numbers – I was born in 1964, it's 2019 now...from '64 to 2000, that's 36 years; '00 to 2019, another 19; 36 plus 19...55. I'm 55, not 54. Arithmetic is more trustworthy than memory. But for belt-and-suspenders certainty, I steal a glimpse of my reflection in the home office mirror. A silly move, since I look like I'm 100 at this instant, not that I'm sure what I expect to see when I think 55.

Per the Oxford English Dictionary, nostalgia is "a sentimental longing or wistful affection for the past, typically for a period or place with happy personal associations." The famous reference book offers a usage example: "I was overcome with acute nostalgia for my days in college." As time passes, unremarkable moments that a young man would navigate without taking special note become milestones worth deep contemplation, their metaphoric flavor – bittersweet.

Oxford's illustration is timely to me. This past weekend, like the weekend to come, takes me back to my college days. I went to a football game last Saturday and I'm returning for another in a few days. Day trips to Pennsylvania from New York City, where my younger daughter now lives. I remain psychically connected to my alma mater. My father went there, too. My core group of lifelong friendships were formed there; they sustain me – often silently across many miles. But until recently, the student version of me felt contemporary, like I was just as much of that time as I am of today. Arithmetic, like it did above, has stolen the last of this illusion from me.

As I sat in the season seat that I've had since the stadium was built (two years after my graduation), that which was once novel and exciting is suddenly common and quaint. I turn to Larry. "This place opened in '88, right?"

He confirms it to be so.

"Eighty-eight to 2019, that's 21 years," I say, with intonation suggesting a really long time. I pause briefly, and Larry appraises me

with a quizzical stare. "Wait," I correct myself, "It's actually 31 years." Which hints, unsympathetically, at the number 50, given my tendency to round up.

The night before the game last week, I visited my daughter at her apartment. Like her father, she was hell-bent for the Big Apple as soon as she stripped off her cap-and-gown. The 8-by-8 living/dining room, shrunken by necessity as it donated the other half of itself to a false wall and my daughter's bed, somehow accommodated more than a dozen of us, though for only 15 minutes for me. She had a big night and full life ahead of her, and I was ready to distract myself with food. So I strolled to Little Italy, where my own father had introduced me to New York. On the way, the walk-up where my wife lived with two of her friends from school when I met her. Only one of the three still lives today.

I ordered calamari and scungilli with medium sauce, just like I did the first day of work at my very first job. I sat at the counter solo, a faded remnant of the wide-eyed 22-year-old me. The bar is granite now, not linoleum, and it's moved from the corner of the restaurant to the interior-back. Long gone – Mouse and Victor, the cook/servers in white t-shirts, pants and soda-jerk paper-and-net hats who collected neighborhood daily-number chits as diligently as they passed out plates. I grabbed the check and approached the register. Mikey was sitting there, perhaps he hasn't moved since 1986.

He's wearing the same suit as during out first encounter. I hand Mikey my American Express. A lot has happened since my Platinum was Green. Mikey takes the card, but his hand is shaking wildly. For a minute, he tries to insert it in the chip reader, to no avail. He beckons to the only other soul in the joint besides us two – a young Guatemalan that Mikey incongruously calls "Joe." Joe grabs Mikey by the wrist and steadies the shakes. Joe takes the card and completes the transaction, and I nod to Mikey for what I'm sure will be the last time.

Up the block, I sit for a cannoli. I daydream (at night) of the boxes of Italian pastries my invincible dad brought home a few times a year.

Back past my wife's way-back apartment again, and then my daughter's, before returning to my hotel. "This isn't mine anymore," I say to myself. "Maybe it never was."

One angel sounds the bell while a second turns over an hourglass. Different characters, representing the stages of life – from a child to an old man – parade in front of Death. On the last level are the Apostles, passing in front of Christ. All these automata are put into operation at 12:30 p.m.

Perhaps the city's greatest technological claim is the printing press. Created by Johannes Gutenberg in 1440, the introduction of mechanical printing to Europe contributed to a scientific revolution. It is regarded as a milestone of human history, playing a key role in the development of the Renaissance and the spread of education to the masses.

South of Strasbourg, overlooking the highway to Colmar, is the Château du Haut-Kænigsbourg. The medieval castle was used by successive powers from the Middle Ages until the 17th century, when it was abandoned. From 1900 to 1908, it was rebuilt at the behest of Kaiser Wilhelm II. After World War I, France claimed the castle in accordance with the 1919 Treaty of Versailles. Because of its association with the German emperor, many people dismissed the complex, regarding it as nothing more than a fairy tale castle similar to Neuschwanstein. More recently, historians have suggested that, although not a completely accurate reconstruction, it is at least interesting for its demonstration of Wilhelm II's romantic nationalist ideas of the past. Since 1993, it has been classified as a "monument historique" by the French Ministry of Culture. Today, it is one of the most famous tourist attractions in the region, attracting more than 500,000 visitors a year.

Arriving in Colmar, we're greeted by a familiar sight. In the middle of a busy roundabout stands a 39-foot replica of the Statue of Liberty welcoming visitors to the city, just as her taller sister does in New York Harbor. Colmar is the hometown of Lady Liberty's sculptor, Frédéric Auguste Bartholdi (1834-1904). Many of his sculptures decorate fountains and parks around the city. The cityscape of Old Town Colmar is renowned among tourists, having been spared the wartime destruction of the past 150 years. Eight centuries of Germanic and French architecture contribute to the town's whimsy, which served as visual inspiration for the animated film, "Howl's Moving Castle (2004)." Though regarded as the capital of the Alsatian wine region, Colmar is one of the driest cities in France (weather-wise). Due to the town's location www.theskinnie.com

next to mountains, clouds blown in from the west rise, and much of their precipitation falls over high ground, leaving the air warm and dry by the time it reaches Colmar.

From Colmar, the flow of the Rhine River leads across the border, to the city of Basel, Switzerland. Located where the Swiss, French and German borders meet, it is Switzerland's second-largest economic center after Zürich, and the nation's third-most populous city (after Zurich and Geneva), with about 180,000 inhabitants. The Basel Munster Cathedral is one of the main landmarks, adding definition to the cityscape with its red sandstone architecture and colored roof tiles. Originally a Catholic cathedral, it was built between 1019 and 1500 in Romanesque and Gothic styles. Today it is a Protestant church.

BADEN-BADEN AND THE BLACK FOREST

East of the Rhine, 25 miles from Strasbourg, is the spa town of Baden-Baden, in the state of Baden-Wurttemberg, Germany. Its name derives from an old plural form of Baden meaning "bathing." The name was doubled to distinguish it from other cities bearing the same name. Thus, Baden-Baden means the town of Baden in the territory of Baden, similar to New York, New York. Roman settlement dates as far back as Emperor Hadrian, when the thermal springs were known as aquae ("the waters"). There are 29 natural springs in the area, varying in temperature from 115 to 153 (°F). The water is rich in salt and flows from underground artesian wells. Ruins of a Roman bath used by the Roman garrison in Strasbourg were discovered in 1847. Emperor Caracalla (C. 210 A.D.) visited the area to relieve his arthritic aches, giving his name to a modern spa.

Also dating from the Roman Empire is Merkur Mountain, named for Mercury, the Roman god of trade and commerce. The summit is accessible by foot, bicycle or the Merkur Funicular Railway - the Merkurbergbahn. Originally built in 1913, at 1,200 meters long it is one of the longest railways of its type in Germany, and climbs gradients of up to 54 percent. From the top of Merkur, we enjoyed a lunch of wienershnitzel (one of many) while watching daredevil paragliders launch themselves into the sky. The summit provides a spectacular panorama of the Rhineland. In the field of view are the ruins of Hohenbaden Castle, the highest peaks of the Northern Black Forest, the Upper Rhine Plain, the Vosges, as well as the cities of Karlsruhe and Strasbourg.

Outside of Baden-Baden, the Mummelsee is a small lake on the north edge of the Black Forest. The site includes a hotel, two restaurants, a grocery and souvenir store, and is very popular with tourists travelling along the Schwarzwaldhochstrasse. The lake has a circumference of approximately 2,625 feet and is surrounded by pine trees, bringing to mind Andy Griffith's old fishing hole. But it is also surrounded by ancient legends and mythology, which claim the lake is inhabited by the King of the Mummelsee and his mermaids. The circular trail around the lake was kept in its original state until 2014, when it was reconstructed with greater accessibility in mind, and artwork by local artists was installed along the pathway.

While visiting both the Mummelsee and the Caracalla Spa, I noticed a remarkable number of seniors intent on remaining active and fit during their golden years. Many used either walkers or sticks similar to ski poles to assist in their mobility. I found this determination admirable, having seen too many American seniors inclined to remain sedentary once activity becomes more challenging.

Another attraction in Baden-Baden is the privately-owned Fabergé Museum, dedicated to the artistic creations of the Russian jewelry firm. Founded in St. Petersburg in 1842, the Fabergé Company was an official supplier to the Russian Imperial court from 1885 to 1917, also selling high-end luxury goods to the Russian and European aristocracy. Besides the czars, clients included the Queen of England and the royal family of Siam (now Thailand). Established by Russian art collector, Alexander Ivanov, in 2009, the museum contains more than 1,500 items. The collection includes a rare silver decanter in the form of a rabbit and the final Imperial Easter egg, the Karelian



n January 14, the Lowcountry Speaker Series will launch its inaugural season, beginning with former secretary of state, Dr. Condoleezza Rice. Subsequent speakers include CNN correspondent, Dr. Sanjay Gupta, National Geographic photographer Paul Nicklen, and former Navy SEAL team leader, Robert O'Neill. The series is designed to attract very high-profile experts and storytellers to the area. Presentations will cover a variety of topics, including world affairs and politics, business and economics, education, and arts and entertainment.

The series was established by James Lamar, who seeks to share his passion for education and learning. Lamar maintains that seeing and hearing directly from an expert can have a dramatic impact on preexisting perceptions and opinions. He hopes audiences will hone their informed opinions, free from the filters of cable news or social media. Audiences will have the opportunity to ask questions and hear answers without someone else's spin.

"I believe if people have an opportunity to see a speaker live, in person, a perception can change," he says.

Born at the Charleston Naval Hospital, Lamar is a Navy brat who moved seven times before graduating high school in the Washington, D.C. area. He grew up adapting to changing geographies, cultures and viewpoints – life experiences that led him to the U.S. Air Force Academy and a career as a naval aviator. While in the service, he sought knowledge outside traditional publications and the 24-hour news cy-

cle. One day, in 2001, during his second combat deployment aboard the USS Abraham Lincoln, he had just returned from one of many missions over Iraq. In the aircraft carrier's ready room, he picked up a popular U.S.-based news magazine and, to his surprise, read that combat missions had been halted for more than a year!

In 2003, Lamar earned his MBA, becoming an investment fund portfolio manager on Wall Street, where he has found similar patterns of misinformation and biased reporting. He has noticed that factual events, regardless of the topic, are becoming increasingly clouded, not only by recognized media outlets, but also by technology-enabled platforms such as social media, where anyone with a smartphone can become a reporter. "Today, opinions on some of the most important global events are being formed based on a 280-character tweet," he

The Lowcountry Speaker Series came about when a friend of Lamar's in San Francisco offered to sell him an established series. Having lived in the South Carolina Lowcountry, and with family still in the area, Lamar saw greater potential in bringing dynamic speakers of varying philosophies to audiences in coastal Carolina and Georgia. "I definitely believe there is a market for these kinds of events in the Savannah, Bluffton and Hilton Head Island communities," he says.

Through connections in the public speaker industry, Lamar sought four dynamic presenters to address different topics, as a means to appeal to as wide an audience as possible. "I have personally vetted each

of these speakers, seeing them at different events, and with each one, their message is incredible."

He stresses that none was chosen out of any political affiliation or agenda. He cites Rice as an example, adding that her background makes her interesting beyond her role in world affairs. "The goal is to find experts in different fields and have them speak in a live forum, so that maybe preconceived perceptions can change," Lamar says.

While Nicklen and O'Neill may lack the name recognition of Rice or Gupta, they are no less deserving of drawing large audiences. "Typically, headliners will sell tickets," Lamar admits, "but other speakers will get people to come back, because the audience is surprised by what they learned."

The Lowcountry Speaker Series is sold as a four-event subscription, rather than by individual lecture, to help reduce costs. Subscribers are permitted to transfer unused tickets to someone else, are guaranteed seating for each presentation, and are given priority for renewals and seat upgrades.

Lamar hopes to make the program an annual event. With only a few months to go before the first speaker takes the stage, he is thrilled by the response from the local community. "I'm excited about our momentum and encouraged that this will become a recurring event," he says.

In the spring, after the second lecture, a survey will be sent to subscribers, allowing them to nominate future topics and speakers. "Our



Breast Cancer: The **Density** Factor

relatively new law in Georgia requires healthcare facilities to notify a woman if a mammogram shows she has dense breasts. St. Joseph's/Candler has been following this practice for more than two years, informing mammography patients via letter when they have dense breasts (along with the results of their screening). The health system has been applying the practice in both Georgia and South Carolina.

The law and St. Joseph's/Candler's proactive approach to informing patients about breast density is not meant to cause anxiety. When women learn they have dense breasts, they are better prepared for risk discussion with their physicians, and able to consider special imaging. Breast density is a risk factor for breast cancer because suspicious areas may be harder to detect within dens breast tissue.

"There is never a case where it's not important that a patient be informed about their own situation," says Lora Reese, director of the Telfair Pavilion at St. Joseph's/Candler. "That's what all this is about - that women are more informed and that there may be other options for them."

Generally, women under 30 have denser breasts – defined as 50 percent or greater fibroglandular tissue, which makes up the ducts and lobules to produce milk. As some women age, fatty tissue replaces fibroglandular tissue, as it is no longer needed to support breastfeeding. Some women have dense breast throughout their lifetime. Breast density is best determined through mammography. St. Joseph's/Candler uses Quantra,

which is software that analyzes breast tissue using a mathematical algorithm to determine

The density of a breast is described on an alpha scale of A to D:

- A Almost entirely fatty breasts
- B Some scattered areas of fibroglandular
- C More than 50 percent fibroglandular
- D Extremely dense breasts

Both dense and fatty breasts are normal and common findings on mammograms. A fatty breast will display clear with shades of gray. Anything that contrasts with the mammogram is easier for radiologists to see. A dense breast, on the other hand, looks like snow, making it more difficult to see abnor-

"You can imagine if you are trying to find something the same white-looking color how hard it may be to see what is an issue and what is not because everything looks kind of similar," Reese explains.

Dense breasts are not the only risk factor for breast cancer. Others include:

- Family history, especially a first-degree relative with breast cancer (mother, sister, daughter)
- Obesity
- Poor diet
- Lack of exercise
- Smoking
- Heavy alcohol consumption

"The important thing is to know what risk factors you have," Reese says. "It's always best to be informed, make sure you get your annual screenings, and talk to your physician about additional options."

St. Joseph's/Candler follows the American College of Radiology screening guidelines, recommending women of normal risk begin annual mammograms at age 40. If you have a first-degree relative diagnosed with breast cancer, mammography should start 10 years prior to age of diagnosis, if that falls under

lu season is here, and everyone needs protection. If you haven't gotten the influenza vaccine, now is the time to do so. Everyone six months of age and older should be inoculated every flu season, which typically runs from October to late-April.


The flu is a highly contagious respiratory illness with mild to severe symptoms that can last for weeks, including high fever, sore throat, muscle ache, headache, possible vomiting and diarrhea. Certain populations are especially at risk of severe symptoms, and people die every year from the flu. For normally healthy adults under the age of 65, the standard flu vaccine is readily available, according to Dr. Michael McNeely, primary care physician at St. Joseph's/Candler Physician Network Primary Care on the Islands.

Most people who get sick with the flu will experience mild symptoms that do not require medical care. They will recover in less than two weeks. Some people may require a visit with their healthcare professional and antiviral medication for persistent flu symptoms. Certain populations and adults older than 65 are more likely to develop flu complications - such as pneumonia, bronchitis and respiratory failure – that can result in hospitalization.

"It can be quite severe especially to people who have underlying conditions," McNeely says.

For those at high-risk of complications, a higher-dosage vaccine is available. This year's high-dose flu vaccine contains four times the amount of antigen as a standard flu shot, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. It causes a stronger immune response and is recommended for seniors and others with weakened immune sys-

"Patients with weakened immune systems typically do not respond as well to make enough antibodies in response to the standard dose," McNeely explains. "The high dose vaccine is a stronger version for those with weaker immune defenses."

Specific groups at high-risk of developing flu complications can include:

- Adults 65 years and older
- Pregnant women
- Very young children
- People with asthma
- People with history of heart disease or stroke
- People with diabetes
- HIV/AIDS patients
- Cancer patients
- Children with neurologic conditions

If you or a loved one falls into any of these categories, talk to your physician or pharmacist to learn if the high-dose flu shot is best for


Regardless of your prescribed dosage, get your flu shot. Age and good health is no excuse. Anyone is vulnerable to the flu. The standard and high-dose flu shots are available at almost every neighborhood pharmacy, as well as most primary care offices. Both flu shots also are available through the St. Joseph's/Candler Center for Medication Management.

> "I encourage people not to delay unnecessarily getting their flu shot," McNeely says. "It's important to understand the immune response takes about two weeks before you really get it to the level where it's reasonable for protection. You don't want to wait until you are in the thick of flu season or exposed to a bunch of people."

Commander Brian Erickson

dr. Brian Erickson has 27 years of service in the Coast Guard. But it doesn't take three decades of experience to know that a 2:32 a.m. Sunday phone call (September 8) is probably not a sign of good news.

The Golden Ray, a large cargo ship loaded with 4,200 new vehicles, overturned after departing the Port of Brunswick minutes earlier. The 600-foot-long vessel rested on its side in the St. Simons channel, well short of the open ocean. Cdr. Norman Witt, captain of the Port in Savannah, ordered Erickson to report to head-quarters at Hunter Army Airfield as soon as possible. Erickson hustled out of bed, and he would not return to sleep for quite a while.

Erickson was born and raised in the coastal region of Port Townsend, Washington, where the movie *An Officer and A Gentleman* was filmed. After completing high school in 1992, he enlisted, serving aboard a succession of two

Coast Guard vessels. After graduating from the Naval Academy Preparatory School at Newport, Rhode Island, he enrolled in the Coast Guard Academy, in New London, Connecticut, earning a degree in naval architecture and marine engineering in 1998.

As an ensign, Erickson's first duty station was aboard the U.S. Coast Guard *Mellon*, a 378-foot high-endurance cutter homeported in Seattle. The ship patrolled in support of fisheries law enforcement and in search-and-rescue missions.

Following his tour aboard the *Mellon*, Erickson earned his wings in rotary aircraft at the Navy Flight School at Pensacola, Florida, in 2001. He then enrolled in the transition course of the Coast Guard, learning to pilot the HH-65 Dolphin helicopter, a search-and-rescue workhorse.

The next duty station for the Evergreen State native was Port Angeles, Washington, on the Olympic Peninsula near the deep-water Strait of Juan de Fuca channel. A natural three-mile long sandbar splits the middle of the channel, separating the Lower 48 from Canada. Between commercial shipping, deep-water anchorage and recreational

boating, the area is busy, and accidents and rescue missions in the surrounding waters are common. Maritime distress calls were especially hazardous in the rough and stormy swells of the Pacific Ocean. While at Port Angeles, Erickson advanced to aircraft commander and served as flight and ground safety officer.

Next, Erickson served as an aeronautical engineer aboard a USCG icebreaker – only the third U.S. surface ship to sail to the North Pole. "Lots of inquisitive polar bears whenever we went ashore on the ice, and caution was the watchword on our surface jaunts near them," Erickson recalls.

Erickson traded his long-johns for T-shirts, assigned to the Coast Guard's Aviation Training Center in Mobile, Alabama, as assistant engineering officer. In 2009, he enrolled at Purdue University, where he earned a master's degree in aerospace engineering.

Advanced degree in hand, Erickson headed to the Coast Guard's Aviation Logistics Center at Elizabeth City, North Carolina. As long-range surveillance engineering branch chief, he was responsible for the airworthiness, engineering, technical and maintenance/overhaul support for the Coast Guard's fleet of HC-130 Hercules aircraft. "Keep 'em flying," as they said during World War II.

Three years later, Erickson received his first assignment to the Coast Guard Air Station at Hunter Army Airfield. As engineering officer, he was responsible for the maintenance and airworthiness of the five on-station Dolphin helicopters.

In 2015, he transitioned from any direct flying or aircraft maintenance to administrative duties at the Coast Guard Office of Budget and Programs in Washington, D.C. As a program reviewer, he helped formulate resource needs for Coast Guard operational forces, an important logistical function.

From Washington, Erickson returned to Hunter as commanding officer of the Coast Guard Air Station. There are 110 Coasties under his supervision, and a fleet of five Dolphin helicopters.



When Erickson arrived at Hunter the morning of September 8, his operations officer was already directing a response to the capsized vessel at the Port of Brunswick. Two emergency Coast Guard response crews were mobilized for the rescue of the ship's crew. At first, it was unknown if any of the 23 seamen or the harbor pilot aboard *the Golden Ray* had escaped into the water. Soon, rescuers learned that four men remained aboard the vessel, trapped inside with no means to escape. How long could the four seamen survive entombed in the sweltering darkness of the ship?

The situation was perilous, and responders would need to urgently summon all of their creative-thinking capacity. Thanks to the efforts of dozens of rescue workers, a chain of small carefully drilled connecting holes in the plates of the ship's hull formed a just-large-enough exit hole. Thirty-six hours after the catastrophe, the last of the trapped crewmen was pulled to safety.

Salvage operations commenced, and Coasties from Hunter would assist in many ways. Their helicopters hovered about the wreck during much of the work.

While *the Golden Ray* captured national attention, another maritime emergency pulled Coast Guard resources in another direction on the same day. Just before daylight, 19 miles off Sapelo Island, a private fishing boat began taking on water. After sending out an emergency signal, the four fishermen on board swam to a nearby weather buoy. A Coast Guard rescue helicopter from Hunter arrived within 45 minutes and, lowering their rescue swimmer into the water, the Coastie crew hoisted three of the men on board. While the chopper made a beeline

to shore, the rescue swimmer remained with the last of the fisherman on the weather buoy, as the chopper's load limits dictated two trips. Fourth man and rescue swimmer safely in the helicopter, a successful search-and-rescue mission in the books, the Coast Guard closed the book on another day's work.

"Semper Paratus," (Always Prepared) is the Coast Guard motto. Erickson and his Coasties live the creed. Their area of responsibility stretches from Melbourne, Florida, to the North /South Carolina border, 450 coastal miles. They respond promptly and efficiently to any call for assistance, making their way to trouble through the water or the air. Just ask the four sailors they helped rescue from the capsized *Golden Ray*.

Erickson has been a multi-engine and float-plane instructor since 2004, as well as an FAA certified airframe and power-plant mechanic with inspector authorization. An ultra-light flight instructor, he can occasionally be seen in the skies overhead piloting his personal aircraft, a Beechcraft Bonanza.

In May of 2020, Erickson will head to Boston, specifically Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). The commander has earned a spot in MIT's Sloan MBA Fellowship Program, a full-time, one-year program for mid-career and senior career candidates to earn an advanced degree in general management and leadership. The Sloan Fellowship MBA program was founded by Alfred P. Sloan, the late CEO of General Motors Corporation, who was a prominent alumnus of MIT.






