

This is an open letter to the mayor of Savannah and members of the City Council. It might seem self-indulgent, for that I am a little embarrassed. But service is my motivation, and sometimes you have to yell (metaphorically) to get noticed.

Less than two weeks ago, Savannah City Manager Rob Hernandez announced his resignation; he will assume an assistant city administrator position in Ft. Lauderdale. Hernandez has been in his current job since September of 2016, when the city council hired him with an annual salary of \$238,000, plus a \$600 per month automobile allowance and \$7,000 in annual contributions to a retirement account – total annual first-year compensation of \$252,200. It's a safe bet that the number hasn't decreased during RH's two and a half years here.

Hernandez is a short-timer, as was his predecessor, albeit for different reasons. As Alderman Van Johnson recently said, "This is a very important position and obviously, we can't seem to retain one in this bureaucracy,"

Mayor Eddie DeLoach says it would be inappropriate to start a search for a new permanent city manager until after the city council election in November. Therefore, DeLoach has proposed the installation of an Interim City Manager, and he apparently advocates for naming Pat Monahan, retired long-time county administrator. Said DeLoach in a recent, published report, "I've spoken to Pat Monahan about the possibility of taking the interim job for us, and he's agreed that he would do that, but I want to get a resumé in front of all of council, and if council approves him and we get things squared away, we'll be about making sure we get him on board."

In our local form of government, City Manager is a very important job, arguably invested with more genuine authority than the mayor or any other municipal official. According to Savannah's own website: "Savannah operates under a Council-Manager form of government. The City Council appoints the City Manager to serve as the Chief Executive Officer of the City...The City Manager carries out Council's policy direction and Savannah's community vision through the day-to-day management and operations of all City divisions."

In my experience, deferring crucial decisions is a bad idea. But it appears that is exactly what city leadership intends to do. Wait until a new council is elected – why? The "new" council is very likely to look like the existing council, with incumbents winning reelection for many, if not all, seats. And what happens in November? With the new council empaneled, they will likely engage some phone-it-in search consulting firm that will blast digital want-ads on platforms that target potential job-hopping lifetime civil servant/bureaucrats. These placement experts will sort through applications and send us a candidate list and a six-figure bill. And council will pick one, anoint him or her

as exceptional, start paying a hefty salary, and quietly hope the guy or gal sticks around for a while and doesn't screw things up too badly. Hardly the template for inspirational and aspirational leadership development.

The career-bureaucrat solution doesn't work. So why not look outside that far-too-confining box? I'll raise my hand. Not to sound cocky, but I think I'm a good fit. I've done a lot of stuff, some of it pretty well, and had successes. I'm smart enough. I'm manically high-energy. I love this city, and I plan to stay here until I die.

I've learned things, mostly through the everyday lessons of livings, but school has helped, too. I'm a product of a public school system; I have a BS in Industrial Engineering from Lehigh University (which taught me operational efficiency), an MBA with a concentration in Finance from the Wharton School (which taught me how to optimize the deployment of capital), and I completed a Fellowship at Harvard University, spending a year at The Advanced Leadership Initiative (mission: to further empower a force of experienced leaders to change society and its institutions... Fellows individually and collectively attack and solve global, national and community problems. One of my fellow Fellows is currently running for president of her country, while another already was head of state in hers.)

I worked in New York at two big financial services firms – Lehman Brother and Morgan Stanley. I advanced quickly, until six years in, my star imploded. Caught in an illiquid market heading far in the wrong direction, the youngest VP in Morgan Stanley's Fixed Income Division was suddenly unemployed. Rather than leap back into a similar pool to the one that had drowned me, I joined four friends and we (naively) founded our own firm to compete with the ones from which we had come. It worked. From five guys and a folding table, we evolved to a firm with more than \$265 billion in assets today.

One of the best decisions I ever made came in 2001. With my kids reaching grade school age, and the toxicity of New York life stripping me of the remnants of my soul, I proposed a radical change. "Let's move South," and I consulted a map. Quickly, "South" evolved into Savannah for no pre-ordained reason. We knew nobody, had spent no time here aside from a single weekend, possessed no understanding of the local economy, and had never uttered – neither my wife nor I – a single y'all. I announced the (arguably rash) decision to my colleagues at Guggenheim Partners and, to my surprise, the head guy replied, "Cool. Why not keep doing what you're doing from down there?" And so I did. By the time I retired in June of 2015, I was co-managing the Fixed Income Division of what has grown to a 3,000-person organization.

Moving South was eye-opening. My neighbors appeared to conspicuously care about one another, without the lure of personal reward as incentive. Slowly, we returned to our Faith. Less slowly, we threw ourselves into public and community service. Serving in this way has been the most organized fun and deeply rewarding endeavor of my life. I have enjoyed the privilege of leading several vital organizations that focus on social benefit and community care, work that I continue

today. I have learned to be less rigid about my delineation between "work" and everything else.

I have built things here – businesses, relationships, a life I love. I publish this magazine that I founded in 2003, run a coffee business that I acquired and retooled, and invest in residential and commercial real estate...and I have a farm.

Which leads me to my proposal: I'd do the City Manager job – because I adore this place – for significantly less than they pay the guy in the seat now. I'll take \$195,000 all-in (which sounds more reasonable than something starting with a "2"). I'm comfortable that my CV will compare favorably with the ones that the search firm will forward our way. So call me, Council, and let's talk.

I'll let you know if I hear back.

THE JOKE'S ON..


I loved your April 5 issue of The Skinnie. I was reading it and beginning to be upset, and then I said, "Oh, no, they got me again this year!!"


It was the April Fool's edition! And, then, I really began laughing! Great edition! Really enjoyed reading it a couple of times.



comprehensive study of high-net-worth individuals, launched by the Angel Capital Association and Wharton Entrepreneurship, reports that 200,000 American angels invest annually an estimated \$25 billion in more than 71,000 start-up deals. Business angels supply more than 90 percent of the outside capital for new ventures in the U.S.

Skidaway Island residents are actively engaged in this investment trend. Savannah's Ariel Southeast Angel Partners (ASAP) has members from across the Southeast, but the Landings is at the center. Approximately one-third of ASAP's members – including about half of the board of directors – live on Skidaway. In addition, a large portion of the group's individual investments comes from here, making it one of the biggest Angel groups in the country. Less than one in 20 of angel groups have portfolios exceeding \$10 million, but ASAP is poised to reach the lofty milestone later this year.

Since 2005, ASAP has invested in 35 companies. The group cur-

rently has nearly 50 active members, including several partnership members, who represent investment groups capable of making larger capital commitments than many individual investors.

"Our members are smart, switched-on, enjoy being involved with early stage businesses," explains chairman of the board Beau Anders, "and bring solid career and life experiences to the group."

Originally from Philadelphia, Anders moved to the West Coast in 1989, where he was KPMG's managing partner-in-charge, as well as the western area partner-in-charge of transaction services. KPMG's Silicon Valley office had more than 750 employees providing audit, tax and advisory services to technology companies throughout the South Bay. Anders was responsible for all market-facing activities of the firm, as well as providing direction and guidance in "making KPMG a great place to work and build your career." Based in Mountain View, he was focused on high-tech businesses involved in mergers and acquisitions. He also has extensive CFO experience, including two initial public offerings and numerous transactions in the medical device and pharmaceutical industries.

When Anders retired in 2009, he and his wife, Chris, decided they wanted to move back east, and discovered the Landings in an online search. "We spent a couple of years deciding where to move, and our search spanned from Savannah up to Williamsburg," he says. "We found this to be the best spot, as it met all five of our main criteria: It isn't a resort, has great medical care, a convenient airport, impressive cultural opportunities and a great social scene at The Landings Club with its golf! 
ment with its portfolio companies.



Margaret Cook-Levy English Class

British-born Margaret Cook-Levy claims to be retired but her home at the Landings is a hub of activity, with frequent incoming phone calls, days spent arranging local and foreign adventures, and a growing collection of medical supplies in the corner of the kitchen.

"During a mission trip to the Dominican Republic, I met some doctors there who have become friends, and I realized that they always need basic medical supplies," Cook-Levy says. "I decided that I wanted to help, so ever since then – with the tremendous assistance of friends and neighbors – I collect a wide range of things, from gauze pads, vitamins and over-the-counter medication like aspirin."

Cook-Levy first came to the Landings 15 years ago to visit her husband's cousin and fell in love with its beauty and amenities. She explains, "When my husband passed away, I decided to rent a condo here for two months and loved it. I sold my house in New Jersey and bought this house seven years ago. My friends from the north were worried that I didn't know anybody here, but nine of them have followed me to live on Skidaway Island!"

She clearly loves her life here, relishing the natural beauty and well-maintained facilities, and the fact that it is only 20 minutes to downtown Savannah.

"I was very warmly welcomed and joined the New Neighbors, which offers great opportunities to meet people," Cook-Levy says. "There were dinners with neighbors and the opportunity to learn and play canasta. I still travel to Europe as well as visiting friends and family in New Jersey, Maine and California. I have three sons, 16 grand-children and six great-grandchildren."

Cook-Levy was born and raised in Rayleigh in Essex, England, which, at the time, was a quiet, rural town. "After leaving the British equivalent of high school, I worked as a matron at a boy's school – I had two younger brothers so I had experience – but I wanted to travel," she says.

In 1959, the British government was offering to pay the travel costs for people willing to work in Australia or New Zealand. Margaret registered with an agency in London to work as a nanny, excited by the thought of relocating to Australia. "But I would have had to commit to being away from home for three years, which seemed too long at 19," she recalls.

Instead, Margaret was able to find a position as a nanny in New York City, which came with a one-year contract and included travel expenses to the U.S. She planned to save her wages, then go on to Australia. It was then that her extraordinary adventure began. "I never

imagined that, within a few years, I would have met and married a Canadian actor, had three children and become a U.S. citizen," she marvels.

When free of childcare duties during the evening, Cook-Levy was asked to coach actors in a Broadway play with British roles, to help improve their accents. The nanny/accent-tutor fell in love with a tutee, and they were married in England on New Year's Eve, 1960.

"My husband worked for the Standard-Triumph Motor Vehicle Company and drove a sports car," Cook-Levy says. "He loved motor racing, so I used to join him working in the pits at the races, timing and scoring the drivers."

Cook-Levy attended driver school and, after a three-day course, was qualified to race herself. The couple went to Le Mans, France, as part of a team in the famous 24-hour race. Following their divorce, her love affair with racing continued.

As a single mother of three boys, ages 7, 5, and 3, Cook-Levy went back to work, driving a minibus for a nursery school and working as a substitute teacher near home in New Jersey. "I would take my youngest child with me, so it was a convenient job at that stage of my life," she explains.

In 1972, Margaret began her commitment to service by bringing the British tradition of Meals on Wheels to those in need in New Jersey. The initiative succeeded and spread throughout the nation, continuing to this day in North America and the UK.

"I then became involved with the Westwood Senior Housing organization," Cook-Levy recalls. "It began with 182 units of senior housing, which the elderly and disabled desperately needed on the east side of New Jersey."

Later, she worked for Habitat for Humanity for 30 years, developing the first Habitat for Humanity project in Manhattan. She served on the organization's advisory board for the northeast region, before becoming president of the board. She was surprised when she was selected to serve on Habitat for Humanity's international board, as she had been nominated a few times before and there are a limited number of spaces. "There were two other women from the U.S. on that board at the time so I never thought I would be selected, but I ended up trotting all over the world to support the work of this impressive charity," she says.

In 1998, she married Edward Levy, a widower, after the two met through their sons. They enjoyed eight happy years together. She ended her career – so to speak – with a 16-year role as the director of community transport in Bergen County, New Jersey, where she oversaw services for the elderly and disabled and the delivery of 1,000 Meals on Wheels a day.

When she made the move to Skidaway Island, she was looking for a church home. "My faith drives me to give back," she says.

"I was visiting and considering different churches in Savannah, when someone said that I would really fit into Asbury Memorial United Methodist Church."

After joining, Cook-Levy met Jan Durham, who had learned of her background and experience with Habitat for Humanity. Six years ago, Durham recommended her to Asbury's pastor to work as part of a newly refocused group providing outreach and support to the community. Cook-Levy really threw herself into her new role with the church. She says, "People are living in dangerous environments with holes in the floor or worse just on our doorstep. We liaise with the city, which helps by providing skilled roofers, electricians and other experts, and the church provides volunteers, materials and funds. A couple had a fire recently and were not insured. We provided work parties to salvage clothes and furniture and did what we could. When you are poor, it is so difficult. People have to choose between insurance or food or prescriptions."

Cook-Levy looks healthy and younger than her 79 years. She suffered a stroke two years ago and, though she is now recovered, she is looking to pass some responsibilities on to others. "It seems a very long time ago that I was living in England," she reflects. "Now I have my Landings home and my Asbury home."

One of her last big projects for Asbury Memorial is to manage the silent auction for the church's annual Springtime Revue, which is planned for Saturday, June 22. "I would encourage my Skidaway Island neighbors to donate to the silent auction and join us for a fun evening," she says. "Last year's event was great fun with comedy, song and dancing. This type of fundraising is vital to help us continue our community outreach, and I am working with Linda Combs to make our 2019 event even more successful than ever before."

SHRINK and DESTROY

Radiation therapy can be an effective part of colorectal cancer treatment, depending on the site and type of tumor

adiation therapy can be an effective component of colorectal cancer treatment, depending on the site and type of tumor. Colorectal cancer can start in either of two places – the colon or the rectum. This cancer is also referred to as either colon or rectal cancer, depending on that starting point. Though these cancers are grouped together because of their similarities, treatment plans can be different. For example, radiation therapy is commonly used for rectal cancer, but not for colon cancer.

"It's more difficult for surgeons to get widely around a tumor in the rectum as opposed to the colon," explains radiation oncologist, Joshua T. McKenzie, MD. "The rectum is located within the pelvis, which is sort of funnel-shaped, and within the narrow neck of that funnel. Colon cancer, on the other hand, typically occurs higher up in the abdomen, and you don't have to deal with nearby structures such as the bladder or pelvic sidewall."

Radiation therapy sends beams of high-energy waves or particles (such as X-rays) to a specific part of the body, damaging or destroying cancer cells and shrinking tumors.

FIGHTING CANCER AND ITS RECURRENCE

Radiation therapy often serves two purposes in the treatment of rectal cancer. Performed before surgery (known as neoadjuvant therapy), it can make tumors easier to remove. Radiation can also reduce the incidence of disease recurrence.

"If a patient has a tumor of a certain size, or if their lymph nodes are affected, there is an increased risk of recurrence, even if the surgeon is able to remove the tumor," McKenzie explains.

Adjuvant therapy, done after surgery, helps prevent cancer from returning, and may involve both radiation and chemotherapy. Reducing the rate of recurrence is important with rectal cancer, because it is even more difficult to treat a second time.

"Pelvic recurrence causes bowel and blad-

der dysfunction and severe pain," McKenzie says. "In addition, it is almost never possible to go back and operate again."

Another type of cancer, in which radiation therapy can reduce the risk of recurrence while protecting nearby structures, is cancer of the esophagus, which is located in the middle of the chest near the heart, lungs and spine. McKenzie treats patients with head and neck cancers post-operatively to reduce the risk of cancer recurrence in that region.

"The most effective treatment plan is determined by the body site, stage, and specific type of cancer," McKenzie explains.

PAINLESS AND FOCUSED

Most patients receiving radiation therapy will receive treatments five days a week for several weeks. The process is painless and similar to getting an X-ray - patients are positioned on a treatment table and are asked to be still while the radiation beams are delivered. Each daily session usually lasts between 10 and 15 minutes.

"Patients with rectal cancer are sometimes treated in the prone position to help reduce the exposure of the bladder and small intestines to higher doses of radiation," McKenzie says. "We shape the beams to conform to the shape of the tumor to help protect patients from side effects or damage to healthy cells."

COLONOSCOPY: A PIECE OF CAKE?

One of McKenzie's radiation therapy patients is Dennis Baxter, who, after being diagnosed with rectal cancer in July of 2017, is now a cancer survivor. Like many others, Baxter avoided getting a colonoscopy, but today he is a vocal advocate for getting screened.

"The peace and assurance you can walk away with after a colonoscopy is certainly worth the effort you have to put in and the little bit of aggravation you might go through in getting ready for it," Baxter says.

When Baxter first discussed the problems he was having going to the bathroom with his doctor, he underwent a CT scan that showed nothing. But his uncertainty for what might be wrong was strong enough that he reached out to Steven Carpenter, MD, a gastroenterologist with the Center for Digestive and Liver Health, to receive his colonoscopy months earlier than originally scheduled. The screening revealed the tumor in his rectum.

That's when Baxter began radiation and chemotherapy at the Nancy N. and J.C. Lewis Cancer and Research Pavilion, followed by robotic surgery performed by Mark Blankenship, MD, of Metro Surgical. More weeks of chemotherapy followed, along with the use of an ileostomy bag (the ileostomy was later successfully reversed by Blankenship), and just over a year after his diagnosis, it was time for another colonoscopy.

"It (a colonoscopy) wasn't a piece of cake, but it was pretty close to it," Baxter says. "It's really not that bad. And the comfort and assurance in knowing that everything is fine is well worth it."

Kenneth Zike

enneth Zike served his country as a U.S. Marine, and then continued to work in support of national defense with Boeing. His spirit of patriotism is evident, and has influenced his work since he first considered the Corps.

Zike graduated from high school in East Prairie, Missouri, in 1955, and headed to Missouri State University, where he majored in mathematics and completed two years of Army ROTC. After college, Zike did the sixmonth basic course at the U.S. Marine Corps Officer Candidate School at Quantico, Virginia, earning his commission as a Marine second lieutenant in June of 1960.

Upon commissioning, Zike reported to the newly-forming 3rd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment, at Camp Pendleton, California. After extensive field training, the infantry battalion left for Okinawa, where it joined the 3rd Marine Regiment, 3rd Marine Division. The 3rd Battalion trained heavily both on shore and at sea (amphibious landings) and was designated the "Pacific Ready" battalion, the first to react in the event of military action. While training in the Philippines, the unit was issued live ammunition in anticipation of an armed intervention into Laos. The Laotian foray was called off at the 11th hour, though Zike later deployed elsewhere in Southeast Asia

Meanwhile, back at Pendleton for two years, Zike was assigned a temporary MOS (military occupational specialty) as a communications officer. He spent 18 months working for Gen. Victor "Brute" Krulak, the commanding general of the 100,000 Marines stationed throughout the Pacific.

During this time, the general was central to coordinating the buildup of U.S. forces in Vietnam. It was a heavy responsibility, and an unpopular strategy on the home front, but Zike remembers Krulak as a splendid and inspirational commander.

In November of 1966, Zike deployed to Vietnam near Da-Nang. Five months later, he reported as the commanding officer of Fox Company, 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines, 3rd Marine Division. Adding to Marine combat lore, 2nd Battalion was becoming known as the "Magnificent Bastards." Fox/2/4 patrolled the bush south of Da-Nang, which was primarily enemy territory. The Marines of Fox/2/4 did daily search-and-destroy missions. Sometimes, they were inserted by helicopter, but usually they

marched into the frequently changing, widely varied terrain.

"We were almost constantly in the bush, contact with the enemy was often, and we did take casualties," Zike recalls.

Zike's primary job as communications officer in the field was to relay accurate information in a timely way to segments within his battalion, and to and from supporting units, such as air, artillery and medical evacuation. This is especially important during combat, and the communications officer must be absolutely certain about all outgoing or incoming communiqués. Lives depend upon it. Zike remembers that whenever he went on patrol in Vietnam as the Fox Company commander, two Marines accompanied him, each carrying a PRC-41 radio – one for communication to his platoons and one for communication back to battalion headquarters.

For three months, Zike led Fox Company on patrols before the Magnificent Bastards were transferred to Camp Evans, a base in the central Vietnam highlands. The Marines stationed there patrolled the surrounding foothills by day and hunkered down in a security perimeter at night. If the elusive enemy chose to make contact, it was usually in the dark of night rather than during the clear vision of daylight hours.

In October of 1967, Zike finished his tour in Vietnam. Then a captain, he reported to the Marine Corps Development Center at Quantico, where Marine personnel, working with civilian defense contractors, developed new and better infantry weapons – rifles, machine guns and rocket-propelled grenades, to name a few types. Zike

became the project officer for the development of an advanced flamethrower. The rocket-propelled prototype he created launched incendiary warheads accurately up to 250 meters, a decided improvement over the dangerous short-range World War II model.

After completing his weapons-development tour and earning a promotion to major, Zike was assigned as the officer in charge of recruiting for a four-state area including Minnesota, where he was based in Minneapolis. Because of the political strife regarding America's involvement in Vietnam, it was a challenging recruiting period for the U.S. military, but Zike and his staff met their recruiting targets.

"I had an additional assignment during that particular tour, which was necessary and important, but not easy to do," Zike explains. Casualty-call duty required him to visit and offer condolences to families of Marines killed in action.

From October of 1972 to September of 1973, Zike was assigned to the "Rose Garden," the nickname for a remote Royal Thai Air Force Base near Nam Thong, Thailand. Three American aircraft squadrons were maintained there, flying bombing missions over North Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia. Zike's 450 Marines and 200 Thai troops maintained security for the base, but it was not exactly an ideal job for hard-charging mobile Marines trained primarily for offensive combat against a known enemy force.

Zike's next assignment was as commanding officer of the headquarters battalion of the Marine logistics base at Barstow, California. During this time, he was promoted to lieutenant colonel.

Two and a half years later, Zike moved 3,000 miles east to Parris Island, where, for 18 months, he commanded all Marine Corps recruiting east of the Mississippi River. He was later named executive officer of the recruit training regiment on base, a by-the-book responsibility with rigid standards.

His last assignment before retirement was as commanding officer of the Marine Barracks of the Concord, California, Naval Weapons Station, once more commanding a 450 Marine security unit. He retired with honors from the Marines in July of 1983, after 23 years of service to Corps and country.

As a civilian, Zike's service continued as senior manager of information security at the Boeing Company, a major defense and aerospace contractor in Seattle. Zike held the position until his final retirement in 1999. While employed at Boeing, Ken and his wife, Debbie, enjoyed downtime at their vacation home in Maine.

Appreciating a "shore thing," the Zikes chose the Southeast coast and the Landings two and a half years ago. Ken, true to his Marine roots, is a regular at the Landings Club Fitness Center.
