We might never be able to fully and accurately measure the societal damage done by suspending traditional education systems for more than a year.

Consider small children: They learn to function as people by interacting with others. Before they develop extensive language lexicons, they employ exaggerated and adorable facial expressions and hand-and-body gestures to communicate their thoughts and feelings. Isolate them; cover their faces with cloth...you are denying them their once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to develop their foundational social and emotional skills. Put a fourth grader in front of a screen for seven hours AND expect him to remain focused on what's happening on the other end...good luck. Tell a teenager to work a difficult math problem set at her kitchen table, which is sticky from her little sister's syrup, while her friend is texting her relentlessly on the laptop that is serving as her classroom...really? And the opportunity divide widens with every day that private school kids roll onto their verdant campuses as their public-school counterparts have few compelling reasons to roll out of bed.

This summer, perhaps more than ever, we need Horizons Savannah. Horizons Savannah is a not-for-profit organization with a clear mission: We partner with youth, their families, and the community to enrich the lives of students through the joy of learning, while developing the skills for success and inspiration to reach their dreams. The program features time-and-research-tested components that differentiate it from other educational interventions. At its core: Six weeks of full-day classroom instruction, recreational activities, cultural exploration, and relationship-building. Kids come to the program from all over the public school district. While they share socioeconomic challenges, they also share the basic human desires for connection, growth and fun. Horizons kids are eligible to join the program as kindergartners and can remain in the community, year-after-year, through high school graduation. Many return after their high school years to work as volunteers or professional teachers as young adults. Horizons operates at the generous invitation of four local independent host schools - Savannah Country Day, Bethesda Academy, St. Andrews School, and Savannah Christian. Horizons students enjoy the resources that these institutions provide as program sites. Young people from host schools volunteer as classroom and activity assistants. Horizons brings people together from disparate circumstances who might never otherwise meet. These connections demystify our perceived differences and create access points later when, for example, a program graduate has a small business idea that warrants funding, and the budding entrepreneur might reach out to a classroom-assistant-cum-banker that she met years before. Horizons also teaches kids to swim. Swimming is both a survival skill and an esteem-building activity, especially for kids who have never dipped a toe in water before.

The program works, even when public policy doesn't. This summer, Horizons is facing a teacher shortage, as temporary programs hastily developed as much to create destinations for some of the infamous "\$6 trillion" that the federal government "created" with a few strokes of a pen have popped up. School districts and service providers, eager to maximize their allocations, are offering outsized pay and pressuring teachers to take it. We're economically rewarding the institutions that were unable or unwilling to effectively innovate to serve their constituents. But, when (maybe if, given the current pervasive political ethos) the \$6 trillion dries up, so will the temporary programs that were hatched to spend it, leaving kids without options in a year or two. Horizons intends to remain true to its mission long after "relief" funds stop flowing.

And what's the solution to our teacher shortage this summer? Guys like me – non-traditional hires – are doing things like teaching middle school language arts, full-time. Which is, in a way, a full-circle phenomenon for my family. I was first introduced to the program when my kids vol-

unteered as students at Country Day. Later, their mother, in the last few years of her life, worked as a middle school teacher after re-



turning to school to qualify to do so, herself. Now me. It's an incredible privilege to have a chance to positively impact a kid. It's a special gift to honor Louise's legacy through service.

Horizons Savannah depends on people like you. We employ professional teachers and limit teacher/student ratios to 15:1 (plus a paid assistant and a volunteer in most classrooms). We feed our kids – breakfast and lunch, every day. We operate all day, five days a week, for six weeks in summer, and we supplement the core session with ongoing engagement throughout the school year. We run a swimming program. We take weekly field trips. We offer a variety of clubs, ranging from Japanese language, to cooking, to running, and many more. And we do it all for a cost of approximately \$1,500 per student for the entire year. This summer, we will welcome approximately 270 students, while nearly 100 remain on our waiting list because of resource constraints.

As I mentioned earlier, Horizons works. There are countless heart-warming anecdotes to support this thesis. But there is data, too. We test each student at the beginning and end of each summer, and our kids demonstrate advancement in reading in math skills that exceed the comparable cohort of their peers.

Horizons Giving Day is our single most-important fundraising initiative each year. "Day" is misleading. The actual day was May 12, but the campaign continues through May. 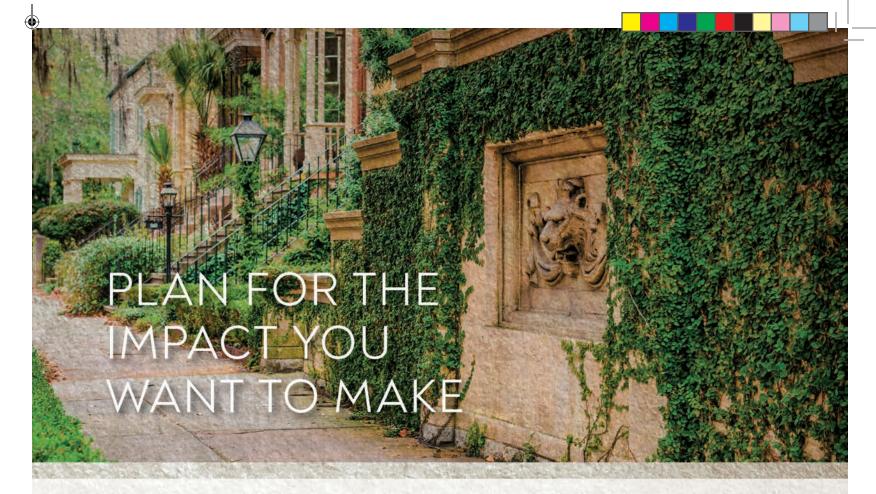

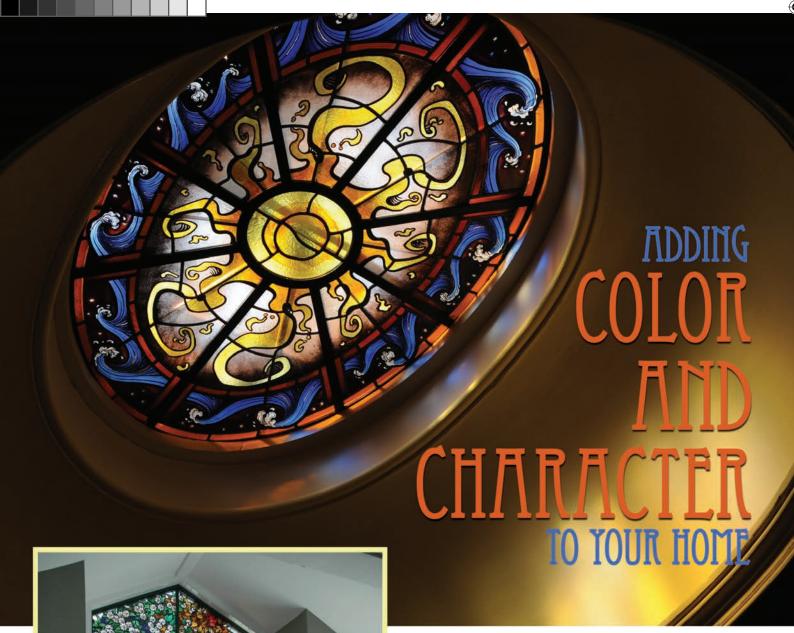

here's something special about incorporating the beauty of stained glass into your home – richly hued panels of filtering light as it streams through a window. Although many people associate stained glass with places of worship, this art form is adaptable to both traditional and contemporary home designs. It adds color and appeal, changing the quality of the interior light and lending another dimension to a room's design.

Jon Erickson of Aurora Stained Glass is a local craftsmen specializing in custom stained glass. "It's an opportunity to add some of your own personality to the space," he says.

A native of Rhode Island, Erickson came to Savannah to attend Savannah College of Art and Design and began working at Aurora in the early 1990s. Around 2003, he took over the business from its previous owner. Since then, Erickson has taken several commissions for older churches in the area, and throughout the eastern U.S. He has contributed to homes in Savannah and beyond, catering designs to customers' wants and needs. He is drawn to the illustrative aspects, which provide a creative opportunity, rather than simply leading colored pieces of glass together.

PROS AND CONS

Benefits of stained-glass windows include:

- Added charm and interest to an existing set of windows
- Enhancement to your home's architecture
- Introduction of additional color to both the interior and exterior of your home

While stained glass windows add an element of privacy and whimsy to your home's decor, that doesn't mean they're appropriate for every room. There's a fine line between decorating with them elegantly and using too many. Some matters you should consider:

- If you choose dark or bold colors, not much light pass through
- Colored glass will distort views of outdoor scenery
- Pieces can change the entire aesthetic of your home
- Altering the shape of your window will change your home's design.

Whatever the project, he tries to make a personal connection. "It definitely makes the job more interesting," Erickson says. "Sometimes you live with these projects for a couple hundred hours or more, and you definitely get a sense of intimacy with them."

HISTORY

Stained glass has gone through many transformations throughout its history, dating back to the 7th century when pieces of colored glass were used in St. Paul's Monastery in Jarrow, England. The oldest intact painted windows are in an 11th century monastery is Augsburg, Germany. From 1100 to 1500, stained glass windows became one of the foremost decorative techniques throughout Europe.

According to Erickson, different types of glass serve many practical functions. Stained glass and beveled glass fall under the category of leaded glass – the framework around the pieces. "The construction technique isn't terribly different," he says, "it's just the final presentation."

There are also different coloring techniques, as in church windows, where much of the detail is painted and fired on the glass.

In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, leaded and colored glass became a popular accent in new homes – opalescent glass doors to obscure the contents of a cabinet, or sparkling glass sidelights flanking a front door. "At that time, if you were well-to-do, it was very popular, and there were shops that cranked out decorative glass," Erickson explains.

Manufacturers tried to speed production by incorporating different elements into the mixture of their paint so it would fire quicker, but later paint formulas eventually led to failure. "Generally, the glass we use, the color is added during the manufacturing process," Erickson says.

COST AND INSTALLATION

Choosing a stained-glass window involves more than shopping

around for designs, sizes and colors. If you're considering a custom designed piece, the cost of professional design and installation will vary considerably, due to several factors. It depends on the complexity of the design, as well as other variables, such as ease of installation, or whether it's new construction or a replacement.

Whenever possible, Erickson arranges a site visit to ensure the window fits the environment it will inhabit and matches the overall design. "Sometimes you consider the exterior view, too, or other details of the home," he says.

He then works up some quick sketches to establish a direction, and it gets progressively more detailed from that. "I do very little on the computer, unless it's typesetting or to roughly compose things. I'm still an old-school guy, I like to pick up a pencil and paper."

Because some stained glass windows are delicate, it's best to hire an experienced installer. They can more easily remove an existing window and replace it with your new one. If the stained glass designer doesn't provide

installation themselves, they should be able to recommend someone they trust to handle their one-of-a-kind piece of art.

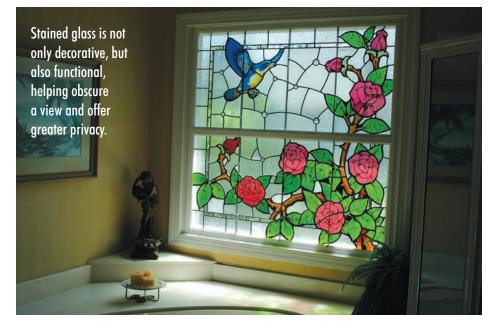
"There's a lot of structure involved in stained glass," advises Erickson, "so if you're going to incorporate it into an existing frame, you have to de-construct it to keep it in as good a plane as possible. Adding things around it can be done, but it's usually more involved than most people realize."

OPTIONS

Custom shops and artisan galleries offer one-of-a-kind works of art, created according to your specifications and custom fit to a particular space. If you love the look of stained glass but aren't comfortable with the expense of replacing whole windows, there are less complicated alternatives - ways to embrace your love for stained glass windows without a major commitment. If a customized design fails to meet your needs, you can find vintage stained glass windows salvaged from older structures in antique shops and flea markets. While new stained glass may not have the patina and character of the old, it also doesn't have the repair and maintenance concerns of older glass. Discovering the history and craftsmanship are sometimes the most fascinating part of choosing antiques or reclaimed stained glass windows.

However, sturdy old glass can be expensive and hard to find, especially when you need several matching windows or desire a particular pattern, style or color. For considerably less money, one might buy a smaller salvaged window from an antique store and have it professionally installed. "It's certainly an option if you come across an interesting piece," says Erickson. "I've repaired and restored a number of pieces that people have brought to me that they were putting in their houses. It's good to repurpose these things and rescue them from near death."

Sometimes, a crack in the glass is much like the nicks and dents on old furniture – part of its charm and patina. A crack is best left in place, unless the glass is ready to fall out. Experts suggest the finger-drumming test: If you drum your fingers on the glass and don't hear a rattle, then the lead is still tight and the window secure. However, if panes rattle, it means the putty has dried and sections of glass have loosened. They will need to be stabilized, which can be a simple



process

Online shopping offers many options for finding the perfect stained glass window, but also comes with drawbacks. Shipping may be cost-prohibitive when added to the price, and there is also the risk of damage while in transit

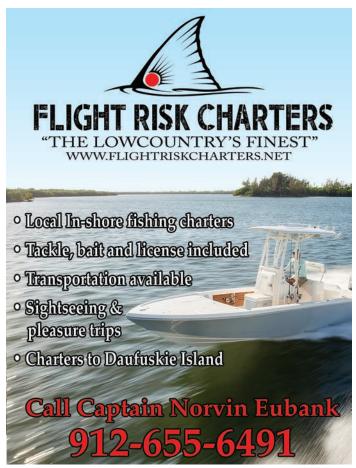
Erickson cautions against acting in haste, especially with an online purchase. "Sometimes, the thing people fail to consider is, they see something on eBay and buy it, then when they get it it's a mess. It would be helpful if it were a more local purchase, to allow closer scrutiny before they buy it."

OTHER ALTERNATIVES

There are many ways to spice up the simplest of designs, according to Erickson, such as incorporating colored panes into existing windows. "It's not taking the cheap way out, but it's certainly lower budget."

Another option is to install stained glass window panels over existing windows. They can match your existing window frame to help it blend with your interior and exterior, without a complex installation. It can be a beautiful alternative to a traditional stained glass window, but make sure you choose high-quality materials that will last.

Resin is another alternative to glass. Similar techniques apply, and you'll find these pieces look like stained glass windows. There are also companies experimenting with printing on glass before it's fired, though Erickson is unable to say it would have the longevity of a tra-

ditional window. Others are mass-producing specific designs. "All my windows areone-offs, essentially, so to scan a single design and have it water-jet cut isn't usually cost effective."

MAINTENANCE AND CARE

Like any other window, stained glass windows are made to take the elements, but need to be maintained every so often – cleaned and occasionally re-puttied. "It depends on the environment and the techniques somewhat, and the maintenance performed on it," Erickson says. "And you need to make sure the window's reinforcement system is in good shape."

If a stained glass window is made from high-quality materials using proper techniques, you shouldn't have any issue with longevity – 75 to 150 years. "It depends on the elements," says Erickson. "The lead (around the glass) is the thing that wears out in 150-200 years. It can all be pulled out, replaced, and the window reassembled good as new."

Such repair offers insight into the manner individual windows are created and installed. Says Erickson, "Materials haven't changed drastically in many hundreds of years. You can take your cue from the past as to what to do, what not to do."

For simple repairs, try taking a little putty, darkening it with lamp black, and pushing it into loose areas with your fingers or a blunt piece of wood. Let the putty dry for a few days, then trim off the excess with a putty knife, and the window will be good as new. You also can try mixing the putty with linseed oil, a time-honored method that makes it easier to brush onto the window. Wipe off the excess with a

and more airtight.

- If the window is in a bathroom or area where moisture causes the solder lines to become chalky, very fine steel wool will remove the chalkiness and return the solder lines to their original patina.
- Don't expose the lead to the elements, as it will eventually leak as the putty weakens. Exterior storm sashes are helpful to protect your windows. Interior sashes don't protect exterior elements but can help insulate and stabilize without changing the home's exteri-
- Cleaning your stained glass windows requires a gentle touch, especially when cleaning an antique stained glass window. A simple solution of mild kitchen soap and a soft, lintfree cloth are recommended for light cleaning. If residue appears, use a cleaner free of

newspaper, and your window will be stiffer vinegar and ammonia, and cleaning products should be non-abrasive and pH-neutral.

• Stops on glass doors are imperative to prevent breakage from a strong wind or a rambunctious child.

If you have a sagging window that can be easily removed from its sash, brace it carefully against a piece of plywood or stiff cardboard and lay it on a flat surface for several days; the sagging will right itself. Be careful when handling old glass out of its sash. It's a lot like handling a large pancake, requiring dexterity, patience and a steady set of hands.

Whether you choose a stained glass window featuring bold colors or clear glass, it's a beautiful way to add interest and a touch of history to your home.



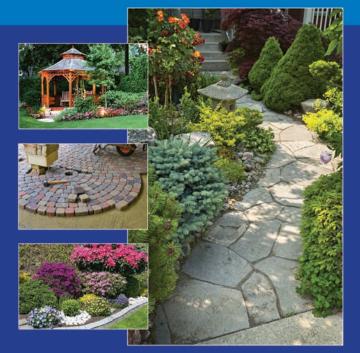

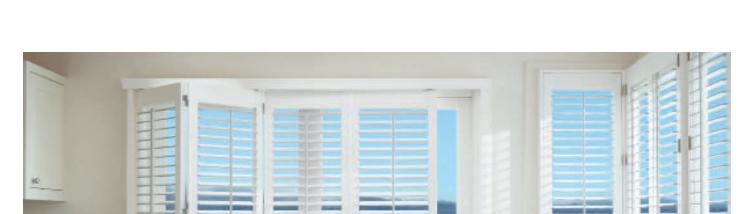

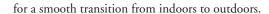

HEALTHY TIPS TO MAINTAIN OR LOSE WEIGHT:

Listen to Your Body When your body is telling you it's hungry: Eat; but eat smartly.

If you eat breakfast and are hungry a couple hours later before lunch, eat a small, healthy snack. When you skip meals or ignore hunger, you start starving and then eat more calories at the next meal. The best thing to do is follow your body. If you are truly hungry then eat.

Eat Small, More Frquent Meals. In order to NOT skip meals, eat small, more frequent meals. You'll never feel too hungry or overly full. If you eat too much at once, your body can only metabolize so much, and then the rest will be stored. When you eat healthy food, you usually don't over-consume calories because your body isn't starving.

Read Food Labels. If you are counting calories, it's important to pay attention to food labels, especially portion size. You may think a particular product has only 100 calories, but the serving size could be five and that afternoon snack is 500 calories toward your daily total. Look for foods that are full of micronutrients - vitamins, minerals and antioxidants.

Put Down the Soda. Want to lose weight? Stop drinking sodas. Soft drinks are full of high-fructose corn syrup, which is a major contributor to obesity. You are basically drinking sugar when that could be a food full of nutrients. Soft drinks are a perfect example of empty calories – foods or beverages that tend to be full of carbohydrates that provide energy but nothing else beneficially to the rest of the body. Replace your afternoon soda with an apple, light yogurt and two tablespoons of nuts. You'll consume the same amount of calories. Even if you think you need the caffeine, it's only going to be a quick blood-sugar rise before it drops and you feel tired again. Fruits, nuts and dairy products are packed with protein and other nutrients that will keep your blood sugar stable.



To get to "less of you," you might require "a lot more of you." If extra pandemic pounds have left you determined to lose weight or you are keen to hone your beach body, it takes more than hitting the gym several days a week. The smart way to lose weight and maintain your newly fit self is to think in terms of wholistic fitness. Keys to successful weight-loss efforts include diet, sleep and stress management.

"If you are in the gym exercising every day, you might see a little change, but without the proper healthy diet you're not going to reach the goals that you want to reach," says Julia Gammon, RD, LD, education specialist/dietitian with the St. Ioseph's/ Candler Wellness Center. "You don't want to go to the gym and put in that hard work and then backslide when you go home and eat poorly or don't sleep well."

Exercise is vital when it comes to weight loss and maintaining a healthy weight. The general recommendation is 150 minutes of moderate aerobic activity a week, or 30 minutes a day, five days a week. Aerobic activities can include running, jogging, cycling, swimming or walking. Get creative, especially if you don't like going to

stairs in your office building; even housework and yard work provide aerobic activity. Add resistance or weight training to your workout two or three days a week. The more muscle you have, the more calories you are burning, because muscles burn more calories

than fat at rest.

Diet and exercise go hand in hand when it comes to weight loss. How many calories you should consume a day varies depending on many factors, including height and activity level. Most average adults should aim between 1,600 to 2,000 calories a day. A dietitiancan help determine how many calories you should aim for daily. It's important to watch how you consume those calories. Are they empty calories that add no nutritional value to your diet, such as sugary beverages and fatty foods? Be sure your diet includes fruits, vegetables and whole grains, with lean proteins to provide

vitamins, minerals and other fuel for your body to operate. In our society, we are accustomed to three meals a day, often with the largest meal at dinner. Try equally distributing calories throughout the day, with a snack or meal eaten every two to four hours. "A lot of times, if you are not consuming enough energy or calories in the first part of your day, then later in the day you may find you are hungrier after dinner because your body is making up for it," Gammon says. "When we eat late and go to sleep, we are not going to have as long to burn off those calories."

Sleep affects your weight. Think about it: When you don't get enough sleep - between seven to eight hours a night for adults - you feel fatigued and are less likely to exercise and eat healthy. Sleep also directly affects the hormones that regulate our appetite. Leptin is the hormone that decreases our appetite. Ghrelin is the hormone that increases it. "When we are sleeping, our bodies increase the hormone leptin to tell us you have the adequate amount of energy so we can sleep," Gammon says. "If you stay up late or don't get enough sleep, that leptin level lowers and the ghrelin increases, making you feel hungrier." For a better night's sleep, Gammon recommends allowing plenty of time between your last meal and bedtime, and to establish a nightly routine. The routine will serve as a cue to your body that it's about time to go to sleep. Stay off phones and electronics right before bedtime to relax your brain.

STRESS

There are clinical studies that show a correlation between stress and weight gain, says Matthew Wojciechowski, St. Joseph's/Candler massage therapist. When we are stressed, the stress hormone, cortisol, rises. This can impact our blood sugar and insulin response, causing us to crave sugary, fatty foods. But instead of grabbing a doughnut or cupcake, Wojciechowski offers alternative suggestions for stress management. Find a physical activity that you enjoy and do it on a regular basis. "Whether Matthew it's sitting on an exercise bike in the gym or Wojciechowski walking the stairs, find something physical to do, because on a very simple level if you are



focused on that physical activity then you are not focused on that stress," he says. Wojciechowski also recommends meditation. He offers a meditation class through the Wellness Center, in which he focuses on practices that help lower the emotional response to stress and staying focused on the now. "There are things we can do through meditation so that when something stressful does occur, our first reaction isn't to jump over the desk," he says. "Instead, it's to step back

and realize this is not good. I need to respond appropriately and make more appropriate choices."

A History of the U.S. Space Force

The Space Force was established December 20, 2019, when the National Defense Organization Act relaunched the Air Force Space Command as the U.S. Space Force, creating the newest branch of the nation's mil-

itary. The Space Force is one of three civilian-led groups within the purview of the Department of Defense. The oneyear-old service branch is responsible for organizing, training and equipping personnel and resources for operational deployment with a focus on activity that isn't limited to Earth's surface. In short, the Space Force is charged with protecting U.S. interests to deter aggression in,

Space operations are vital to national security and are likely to become increasingly. so as interplanetary travel and activity becomes a relatively common thing. The Space Force is dedicated to meeting the national security challenges that arise as a result of rapidly advancing science and technology.

from and to space.

The roots of the Space Force can be traced to 1945, when American military forces were organized under several differ-Command was established. The Gulf War of 1990 is sometimes referred to as the first space war, due to the first major deployment of space resources like satellite targeting and the resultant rapid success of American-led coalition forces against Iraqi forces.

"Semper Supra" (Always Above) is the motto of the Space Force, appropriate for the high-in-the-sky equipment it uses, like the Global Positioning System (GPS), the U.S. Missile Warning System and an extensive and complex military satellite communications system.

Thus far, most of men and women who have joined the Space Force – "guardians," as they are known - have transferred from the Air Force. In 2021, additional troops from the Army and Navy will transfer into the Space Force, nearly tripling its ranks. More than 6,000 active-duty personnel will be under the command of Gen. Jay Raymond, the current Chief of Space Operations. The Space Force will add a reserve component,

Consider the pace of American space activity. In 1969, NASA landed a manned craft on Earth's moon. This year, Rover landed successfully on Mars. The Earth-moon trip is approximately 239,000 miles, one way. The average distance between Earth and Mars is approximately 140 million miles (it varies based on the relative orbital positions of the two planets). So, the Mars journey covered almost 600 times the distance of earlier lunar explorations. That's quite an improvement in fuel economy! Apollo 11's round trip to the moon and back lasted ent Air Force commands. These elements eight and a half days. Rover's trip to Mars were unified in 1982 when Air Force Space required seven months. If you're doing the math, that's almost 600 times farther in less than 60 times as many days. So, effectively, we've figured out how to travel 10 times faster in space, while going much farther, in half a century.

> The mission to Mars is only the latest in the many accomplishments of American space exploration. The Space Force will work to ensure American interests are secure as Terrans begin to virtually and, perhaps, physically, colonize space.

Union Mission
Announces a New
Emergency Housing
Program for
Unaccompanied,
Homeless Women

Union Mission has expanded offerings to a wide array of services for the homeless, and it is expanding again. The agency has identified a strategic gap in the provision of emergency housing in the region: A lack of dedicated emergency housing for unaccompanied, homeless women. In fact, there is no such program anywhere along the I-95 corridor in Georgia. To remedy the shortcoming, Union Mission has launched a \$1.5 million capital campaign, "A Haven for Her," to fund renovations of the building at 125 Fahm Street vacated by J.C. Lewis Health Care.

Renovations will include building out the space to comply with COVID-19 safety guidelines, upgrades for ADA and code-related compliance, as well as upgrades to the electrical, plumbing and fire suppression systems. The facility will help address the critical social issues of unaccompanied, homeless woman in our community by providing an additional 32-beds to the Savannah Continuum of Care (CoC) housing inventory which will serve more than 100 women annually.

Union Mission's Grace House for women will be modeled after its successful Grace House for men program. This will allow

Union Mission to draw from an emergency housing program that has an 87 percent bed utilization rate. Union Mission continues to help transition people to safe, stable housing, along with providing more than 78,200 meals and 97,130 nights of housing annually. Union Mission believes it can mirror that level of success for unaccompanied, homeless women, making a genuine difference for this underserved and deserving segment of the homeless population.

Grace House for women will be a 90-day program that provides tools women need to establish and maintain safe, stable housing. Union Mission's structured environment allows each client to be assigned a case manager, wellness checks, employment support, and referrals to primary care/mental health providers. For clients in mental health crisis, the Union Mission Counseling Center creates individual service plans with clients.

The capital campaign is off to a significant start with the City of Savannah awarding Union Mission \$310,000 through an Emergency Solutions grant authorized by the federal government's Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. Union Mission plans to solicit funding from various

BY THE NUMBERS

According to the Chatham-Savannah Authority for the Homeless 2019 HUD PIT Survey, there are 219,911 women experiencing homelessness in the United States and about 2,297 women in Georgia. Savannah-Chatham County has the second highest rate of homelessness in the state. On any given night, more than 180 women in Chatham County are classified as homeless. Women make up approximately 28 percent of the homeless population in Savannah, yet there is no emergency housing program specifically focused on unaccompanied, homeless women in the Savannah-Chatham County area. While women are accepted at other facilities, homeless women often avoid staying in shelters that also house men, citing previous trauma. Studies have shown up to 70 percent of homeless women have been victims of domestic violence, and 41 percent have been victims of sexual assault.

Homeless women may be living alone on the streets, sleeping in their cars, couch-surfing, or if able, living in motels. These women can be veterans, those experiencing domestic violence, or released from penal systems, as well as women who have lost jobs and face evictions due to COVID-19. Data also shows that women who do not have

stable housing are more likely than men to experience trauma, assault, and be diagnosed with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder.

In 2020, the emergency housing program at Union Mission's Grace House for men was able to transition 78 percent of its clients to stable housing. Its Magdalene Project for women with children transitioned 86 percent of its clients as well. And Union Mission remained open and provided services without interruption during the pandemic that plagued our nation.

ABOUT UNION MISSION

Since 1937, Union Mission has partnered with people in the greater Savannah-Chatham County, Georgia area to end homelessness through housing and supportive services. Its evidence-based programs are designed to alleviate and eliminate the personal and systemic barriers that cause and perpetuate homelessness and poverty with the goal

of getting people into stable housing. The organization operates the 32-bed Grace House Emergency Shelter serving a general



population of men, including men striving to re-enter society from prison. Beyond Grace is transitional housing for 24 months for 26 men that have completed their 90-days at Grace House. Magdalene House, with six suites for families, provides housing and supportive services for single women with children. Union Mission's Dutchtown Campus has 48 apartments in south Savannah providing permanent supportive housing. Responding to the HIV/AIDS epidemic, the organization developed the Phoenix Project, Daniel Flagg Villas and TIP

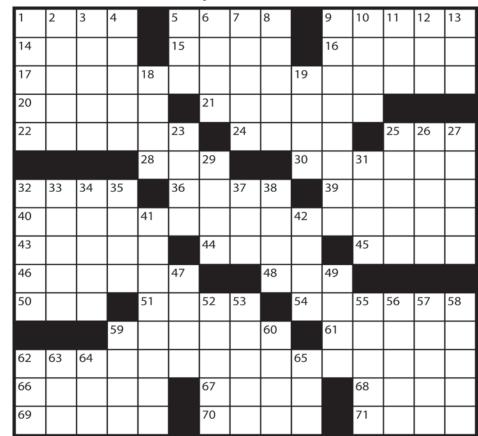

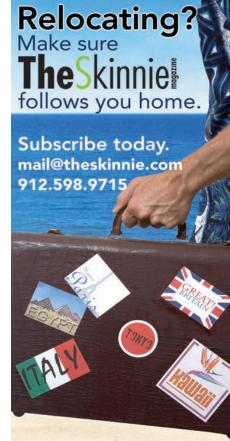

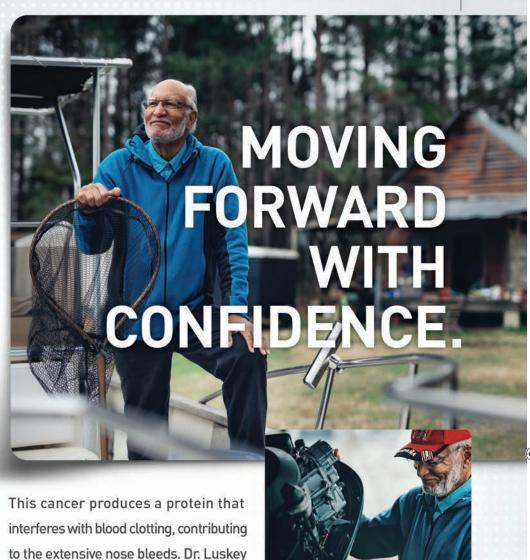
